Government entities that are exempt from obtaining a Department of Industrial Relations Contractor Registration are not required to be registered with DIR.

**ATTACHMENT 3 – PREVAILING WAGE REQUIREMENTS
(ARTICLE 12 OF SAMPLE AGREEMENT)**

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12.4. *Compliance with Law:*

- a. In addition to the above, Consultant stipulates that it shall comply with all applicable wage and hour laws, including without limitation Labor Code sections 1725.5, 1775, 1776, 1777.5, 1813, and 1815 and California Code of Regulations, Title 8, section 16000, et seq.
- b. If Consultant is a public entity exempt from obtaining a Department of Industrial Relations Contractor Registration but subcontracts work that is subject to prevailing wage requirements, Consultant shall comply with Labor Code section 1773.3. Consultant shall ensure that any subcontractor performing such work is currently registered with the DIR pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5, and Consultant shall timely register the Agreement using Form PWC-100 with the Department of Industrial Relations, as required.
