## Trees, Trees, More Trees, Please

Problem: It's getting hotter and there isn't enough shade ...at the lunch tables or in the play yard or when we line up. Can we safely plant a tree and which type?

- 1. Conduct a tree investigation.
  - Compare and contrast an area without a tree and one with a tree. How do they differ? How might people, animals, or the Earth be affected? What can we measure? What tools might we need?
  - Take a tour of your school yard, neighborhood, and notice the trees. Describe how they are similar, how they differ. Take a closer look at a tree, what do you see? What are the parts of a tree? Draw what you see. What questions do you have? What could you measure on your tree?
